



Round 1 Middle School Information Updates

For the 2017-18 school year, the Board of Education decided to continue with the current practice for middle school enrollment. Students can still apply to their middle school feeder and, as in the prior school year, they will receive priority. Due to a statewide teacher shortage and middle school buildings being at capacity, students that applied for 2017-2018 school year did not receive an automatic assignment for 6th grade.

2017-2018 Round 1 middle school assignment data:

96% of the 6th grade applicants who requested their middle school feeder as their first choice received their middle school feeder assignment.

97% of the 6th grade applicants requested a choice school ranked higher than their middle school feeder and received a higher choice school assignment.

There were **2,722** sixth grade applicants who requested their middle school feeder in Round 1. Out of these 2,722 applicants, **79** of them were designated to another school they did not choose.

Q: How many students listed their middle school feeder ANYWHERE on their application and did not get a choice school?

A: **3%** (79 / 2,722) of sixth grade applicants who listed their middle school feeder anywhere on the application and did not get a choice assignment.

2017-2018 Round 1 middle school request data:

78% of the 6th grade applicants requested their middle school feeder as one of their choice schools.

56% of the 6th grade applicants requested their middle school feeder as a first choice request.
